LOCAL REGATTAS:

A good start was made when the club won the Redding Shield on opening day, but could not hold off Petone in the Norton Cup and Mothes Shield. The club, however, finished ahead in one of the extra local regattas. The Novice Four and Junior Pair consistently won at local regattas, whilst the Senior Four, Malden Four and also as a Junior Four, the Maiden Double Sculls and the Senior Eight all recorded wins at local regattas also. The club retained the Novice Shield and regained the White Horse Cup after a good race for Senior eights.

Your Committee have pleasure in presenting the Club's 93rd Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ending 30th June, 1959.

. INTRODUCTORY:

The 1958/59 season was from many aspects the most successful the club has enjoyed for a number of years. Wins were recorded in almost all grades except, oddly enough, crews generally showed best form at Status rather than at Local regattas although a certain measure of success was achieved in the later regattas also. A loyal and hard working Ladles' Committee earned the club's appreciation and ensured the success of a number of social functions. Clubbouse renovations, boat covers and addi-tional furniture were all necessary, but for the season greatly increased the expenditure. Crews were given greatly increased the expenditure. Crews were given valued support at regattas by old members of the club and by some parents of present members. Members have done a great amount of work on the plant and on the clubhouse and the year can be marked as one of steady

FINANCES:

The generous bequest of the late G. E. Warburton has resulted in the club receiving £1900, the major portion of which has been invested in a 44 per cent Government Loan. Payments were made into the club's Centennial Fund and the financial position is quite sound despite the high expenditure which was incurred during the season. The hiring of the hall is still the main source of revenue. A number of outstanding subscriptions were received but it was necessary to write off some which are now irrecoverable and there are still a number of subscriptions which are outstanding. The NZARA levy has now increased by 1/- per member and the total now paid to both the WARA and NZARA total 5/6 per member in addition to the affiliation fee.

COMMITTEE:

Due to unforescen circumstances a number of changes were necessary in the administration of the club. Both Mr. W. Hillock, for business reasons, and Mr. R. O. Weenink, for family reasons, were obliged to resign from the Selection Committe and they were replaced by Messrs. A. G. Johnson and R. S. Leckie. Mr. A. C. Staniford found it necessary to resign as Treasurer and Mr. D. A. Cameron was appointed in his stand. n necessary to resign as Treasurer and Mr. D. A. Cameron was appointed in his stead. Mr. R. O. Weenink also resigned from the General Committee early in the season and Mr. R. J. Joyce was appointed to fill the resultant vacancy. All of these resignations were received with regret but it was indeed fortunate that willing and competent substitutes were effective. petent substitutes were offering.

W.A.R.A.:

The club is appreciative of the number of regaltas which the Wellington Rowing Association held during the season. The extra local regattas gave crews valuable racing experience but these of course were held only because of the time and work the Association officials gave to organ-ise and run the regattas. Of the members from this club, Mr. L. Smith was again an able Association Secretary, and Mr. V. E. Donnelly a competent Association Treasurer. Messrs, G. H. Salder, C. E. McMahon and F. L. Scott were appointed the club's delegates on the Association.

As with most other clubs, import restrictions has put the position regarding oars in rather critical state. stocks of both the racing and training oars have diminished and a number of new oars are now required. Although the club has sufficient boats at present, some of them, in particular the eight, will need to be replaced, whilst the new rules regarding the unrestricted use of E, and E, boats passed by the NZARA, which takes effect next season, will require the purchase of more B. and B. plant.
In fact two boats, a B. and B. single and a B. and B. convertible Pair/Double Sculler, have been ordered but are not expected to be received for some time.

A steady and continual amount of work has been done on plant repairs and maintenance, and is still carried on during the winter and the racing and training plant will be in good order for next season.

Much of the older plant has required new swivels and. in some cases, new seats and riggers, which has increased the expenditure on plant maintenance and given some members many hours of work.

Due to rough water conditions at most regattas, Wellington was a notable exception, and particularly drift-wood at Wanganui, some of the racing plant was holed. These boats have been expertly repaired and this has been largely due to the knowledge and skill of Mr. A. G.

Covers have been made for all the racing plant, which again incurred further expense, but the boats are now all adequately protected when travelling and when not

in use.

A list of the club's plant appears as an Appendix to this Report.

CLUBHOUSE:

The Clubhouse is continuing on a month to month rental and indications are that this will not alter in the immediate future. The action of the City Council in annexing the land in front of the Clubhouse occasioned the Committee to write a strong letter of complaint. In this regard the Committee was pleased to receive assistance and advice from three clider members where uncellance and advice from three older members whose unsolicited assistance showed that the Club is well supported and must be in mind of many old members. The matter was discussed and the club has retained access how and whenever required to the front doors.

Extensive renovations have been completed in the hall, supper room, entrance and hallway, with most pleasing effect. Appreciation is due to a member, Mr. E. Rogers, for the tremendous amount of work and skill he displayed in this regard. He was assisted by some of the other members of the Club and it is worthy of mention that whilst this work carried on, the work on plant mainten-

ance also continued.

The roof has been partially patched but still requires further repairs, whilst a start has been made on repairing the skid (another big job), and both skids are expected to

be in good working order for next season.

In all, a very large amount of work has been done in and around the clubhouse and reflects great credit on

those concerned.

STATUS REGATTAS:

As mentioned in the introductory remarks, the club's crews achieved most satisfactory results on the water during the season. The crews travelled extensively during January and February. The early date of the New Zealand Championships at Lake Walhola caused many of the other recently to be held early also and this tended to and Championships at Lake walhola caused many of the other regattas to be held early also, and this tended to rush a period of the regatta season. This gave rise to hurried selection of crews, thus adding to the usual onerous tasks of the Selection Committee. Entries often had to be made for two or three regattas before earlier regattas had been held, so that little guide was given on the form of crews and the composition of them. It is, therefore a credit to the Selection Committee that meny therefore, a credit to the Selection Committee that meny crews did so well.

The club was represented at the Whakatane, Picton, Wairoa, Lyttelton, Lake Waihola, Wanganul, Wellington and Easter regattas, where no fewer than thirty placings were obtained. Winning crews were the Junior Pair,
