Gentlemen,-

Your Committee takes pleasure in presenting the Club's 94th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 30th June, 1960.

The good progress of the Club's activities both on and off the water was maintained last season, with the result that 1959/60 was pechaps the best season that the Club has enjoyed in the post-war years. There is no reason why this progress should not continue, and with the New Zealand Championships scheduled to be held in Wellington next March, there is the opportunity for the Club's crews to achieve top honours provided adequate preparation in well-reason. tion is made,

The Club continues to be fortunate in the active interest which is shown by old members and also by the parents of present members, and is strengthened by the exceilent work and steady support of the Ladies' Com-

A sombre note was the passing of the Club's President, Mr. A. D. Bayfeild, of whom further mention is made later in this report.

### FINANCIAL:

Despite high expenditure on Clubbouse renovations and repairs, skid replacements and also plant repairs, the Club's finances remain in a reasonably sound position. The casing of import restrictions, however, has allowed orders to be placed for new boats and oars to the value of £1200 which will greatly deplete the Club's balances. Both subscriptions and regatta donations have increases. But it is still the biging of the hell which provides the but it is still the hiring of the hall which provides the main source of income.

A further £250 was received from the estate of the late G. E. Warburton, and his generous bequest has now augmented the Club's fund by £2350, the larger portion of which is invested in 42% Government Loan.

Outstanding subscriptions show a marked decrease on previous years, but it was necessary to write off some of these which are now irrecoverable.

# COMMITTEE:

Fortunately, no changes in the composition of the Committee were required during the year, although the Secretary, Mr. W. Hillock, departed overseas in early June, but expects to be back in New Zealand early next

The Committee held 13 meetings during the year, the

# MEMBERS:

The Club was again strengthened by the addition of a number of new members, the majority of whom showed keenness and ability. Apart from some very promising Novices, some Malden, Junior and Schior oarsmen joined the Club, building up to what should be a very strong membership in the near future.

# WELLINGTON AMATEUR ROWING ASSOCIATION:

Messrs. F. L. Scott, L. F. Schwass and R. J. Vine were elected your delegates on the W.A.R.A. Until he was transferred to Auckland in February, Mr. I., Smith was again a very competent Secretary and he was succeeded by Mr. R. O. Weenink. Mr. V. E. Donnelly was again a sound Treasurer.

The Association has obtained the lease of a site at Korokoro which will be used to provide rowing amenities on the Korokoro course. The Association purchased a large shed from the Harbour Board and with volunteer labour recruited from the three Clubs this shed is being erected on the site. The shed is large enough to store boats and also contain the aforementioned amenities.

A new B, and B, single was purchased from Litecraft early in the season and with whom an order was placed for a B. and B. Double Sculler/Pair, but as it is now known that the delivery of this bout will not be for a considerable time, an application has been made to purchase a similar boat overseas. Orders have also been placed for a racing eight and a B. and B. Four, which are expected to arrive early next season, and these will be welcome additions to the Club's racing plant, particularly in view of the unrestricted use of B, and B, plant as from October 1st, 1960. Another class of boat which will come into being is a coxed B, and B. Pair, and consideration will need be given to obtaining this type of boat.

Some members have been busy during the winter on plant maintenance and this should ensure that both racing and training boats are in good condition for the coming season.

At the conclusion of the rowing season the Club was able to purchase, through the good offices of Mr. Davis, ance to purenase, through the good omices of Mr. Davis, a coaching boat and also purchased a 12 h.p. outboard motor. This boat was loaned to Mr. W. Hillock to coach the inter-provincial eight, and its advantages were most obvious. Provided sufficient couches are available, and with the increased membership more are needed, the coaching boat can be of immeasurable value in further

raising the standard of rowing within the Club.

Sixteen new racing oars were ordered early in the season, eight of which arrived in sufficient time to be used at most of the regattas. The Club's stock of oars had depleted to such an extent that whilst boats were had depleted to such an extent that whilst boats were available for training, on some evenings crews had to walt for oars before getting on the water. A further sixteen oars have now also been ordered and this should provide a sufficient supply for a number of years.

The easing of import restrictions has occasioned this heavy outlay on new plant and, in addition, much of the present plant, whilst with careful maintenance is still in good condition has reached a fairly advanced age.

# CLUBHOUSE:

Although the Ciubhouse is now 76 years old, it is still in a sound condition. The present month-to-month rental continues and there is no todication that this will alter in the near future.

Most of the interior of the Clubhouse is now quite attractive and this is due to the good work of some of the members, as, continuing on from last winter, the locker room has now been renovated, whilst the floors have been sanded and oiled and new linoleum has been laid in the supper room.

A new hot water system has been installed in the supper room which also provides hot showers in the locker room. The roof has been partly repaired, but still re-

quires further patching.

A new but limited skid was completed early in the and one of the bottom piles was lost. A few members have spent a great deal of time on this skid, which still requires repairs, but it is hoped that it will be serviceable for next season. In this regard the Wellington Harbour Board has greatly assisted with materials and the loan of tools.

With the New Zealand Championships scheduled to be held in Wellington, it is essential that the Clubhouse and

facilities are in good condition.

# STATUS REGATTAS:

The Club's crews competed at the Picton, Christchurch, Wanganui, Wellington and N.Z. Championship regatias, where a good record of nine wins, fifteen seconds and twelve thirds was achieved. A highlight in the season's rowing was the performance of the Junior Eight in win-ning all status starts in their grade, culminating with their victory in the Junior Eights at the N.Z. Championship regatta. From this eight a Junior Four and a Junior Pair recorded wins, as did the Maiden Four, a consistent Maiden Pair and a Maiden Single Sculler. The Senior Four, Maiden Eight and a Novice Four also revealed a good standard of rowing by being consistently placed in

status regallas.

The Club entered in two championship events in which the Junior Eight rowed well to qualify for the Championship Eights final, but were unplaced in that race, being unlucky enough to draw near the outside in the least favoured conditions. The Senior Four showed

good form to win their repecharge heat to qualify for the send-finals in the Championship Fours, and, but for hit-ting a launch very near the finish, would certainly have qualified for the final. They rowed very well, however, to finish fourth in the Plate race against 24 other crews.

# LOCAL NEGATTAS:

The Club competed at a large number of local regatlas The Club competed at a large number of local regatts both in Wellington and Wenganui with quite good results. The kedding Shield was won by Wellington, whilst Petone made sure of the Norton Cup, but Star was finally successful in the Mothes Shield for the first time for a number of years. The White Horse Cup was lost to Petone, but the Club retained the Novice Shield, awarded for the best-performed Novice crews on the harbour, for the eightn consecutive season.

The Club also competed at Wangsmil in Jury Cup and again in the pre-Championship regatta (Wootworth's Rose Bowl), when Star were second among the nine competing

clubs.

# CLUB RACES:

Unfortunately, it was not possible to hold as many Club races as was hoped, but large entries were received for those races which were held and competing members durived great benefit from these races.

# INTER-PROVINCIAL EIGHT:

Four members of the Club, namely, Messrs. L. F. Schwass (str.), R. R. Davies (7), R. J. Joyce (6) and C. E. McMahon (bow), were selected for and rowed in the Wellington Provincial Eight. The coach was Mr. W. Hillock, who used the Club's new coaching boat to good effect, and the crew were loaned the Club's eight for the actual race in Wanganui. Auckland were the ultimate winners, with Wellington in fourth place close behind the placed crews.

### SOCILABLE

In almost all of the Club's social functions, the Ladies' Committee were evident with their excellent work, which largely ensured the success of the socials. The following functions were held:-

Opening Day.—The Club's opening day was held on October 10th, 1959, when the 1959/60 rowing season was officially opened by His Worship the Mayor of Wellington. The Redding Shield regatta was held and was followed by a social function which was well attended. During the afternoon the Ladies' Committee attended to the afternoon tea arrangements.

Xmas Dance. A large crowd were present at the Xmas Dance held after the Norton Cup regatta on December 12th, 1959. These dances are much more popular than a few years ago, the probable result of increased membership and certainly because of a loyal and hard-working Ladies' Committee.

Old Members' Day.—It was pleasing to note the much larger numbers of old members who attended this end-of-the-season function. Club races, including the Novice Pairs and the Club's swimming race, were contested by a large number of members. This function was held on March 19th, 1960,

Prize-giving Dance.-Although the attendance slightly less than at previous dances, the Prize-giving Dance held on May 21st, 1960, was still well attended and was again very successful. Mrs. Schwass, a member of the Ladies' Committee, presented the prizes, and in all it was an enjoyable evening.
