STATUS REGATTAS:

Club crews competed in five status regattas during the season at Picton, Clive, Wanganui, Wellington, and the N.Z. Championships at Kerr's Beach, to gain 6 wins, 11 seconds and 11 thirds. This was a big improvement over last season but greater effort and determination could change the placings into wins.

In all twelve maiden oarsmen gained status wins which should ensure a strong Junior class next season. The Maiden Eight won at Picton but could not register another at later regattas but were unlucky in that injury and transfers kept changing the composition of the crew. However, it is worthy to note that the Maiden Eight win at Picton was the first such win in the Club's history.

The Maiden Four also won at Picton but in later regattas could only achieve places. They showed determination in renewing their training efforts and under the able coaching of Mr N. Lynch, who also handled the Maiden Eight, gained a well deserved and hard fought victory in the N.Z. Championship Regatta. The consistent Junior Eight obtained a number of status placings, most notable being their second by 2 feet at the Wellington Regatta to the eventual N.Z. Championship winners. At these Championships the Junior Eight was placed third which was a little disappointing in view of their very good training rows immediately before this regatta.

The Senior Four, after a very good second at Pieton, could not gain a further status placing but they were probably the hardest training crew in the Club and their example in this regard was a credit to the c.ew. Unfortunately due to circumstances beyond their control two members of this crew were unable to row in the N.Z. Championship and the Senior Pair was asked to fill the breach. This new combination could not do full justice in the time allowed and the crew did not reach the semi-final. This also affected any chance the Senior Pair may have had of reaching the semi-final.

It was pleasing to again compete at Clive after a lapse of a number of years and the Club was able to register two wins in the Junior Pairs and Novice Fours.

The successful Novice Four was composed of Wellington College boys who joined the Club to continue rowing during the summer vacation. Their achievement in gaining two wins and two seconds in four status starts was most commendable and was due in no small part to the Wellington College coach, Mr D. Miller, also a member of the Club's Junior eight.

Status results appear as an Appendix to this report.

LOCAL REGATTAS:

The 1961/62 season was unique in that the Club won all W.A.R.A. trophies. A good start to the season was made when the Club won the Redding Shield and later the Norton Cup and Mothes Shield. The Novice Shield and Palamountain Plate (Youths), were also won by Club crews and the season wa successfully concluded by again winning the White Horse Cup. It is thought that this is the first time the one Club has won all local regattas.

Club crews also competed in the Jury and Woolworth's Cups at Wanganui where an overall improvement was also apparent. In the later regatta it was not until the final two races that the result would be obvious as at that stage Star were overhauling Union's earlier lead.

Local regatta results also appear in an Appendix to this report.

CLUB RACES:

A greater number of local regattas restricted the number of Club races which could be held combined with the fact that status crews were kept busy training on rowable weekends. An interesting and successful departure from normal procedure was made early in the season. Crews were selected to train for Club races with the view of having senior and junior oarsmen training and racing with maidens and novices. This had the desired effect of giving less experienced oarsmen more intensive instruction early in the season.

Club race results appear as an appendix to this report.

INTER-PROVINCIAL EIGHTS:

The inter-provincial eights race held at Lake Karipiro over Easter was also a trial for Empire Games selection and consequently there was no restriction on the number of oarsmen from one Club in each crew. The Wellington

Association decided, in view of the importance of this race, to enter a crew and provide promising local carsmen with intensive coaching and valuable experience. Star members gaining selection in this crew were Messrs B. Armstrong, F. Borrett, G. Christie, W. Dent, J. Morgan and D. Winter. The crew was coached by Messrs. F. Scott and W. Armstrong who with the able assistance of Mr D. Cameron spent many hours in coaching.

In probably the hardest eight cared race in New Zealand the Wellington crew rowed well but could not match the speed of the New Zealand composite eight who won rather easily followed by Auckland Country and Auckland Town.

There is no doubt tht the individual members of the Wellington eight derived great benefit from rowing in the crew which will be valuable in coming seasons.

SCHOOLBOY ROWING:

The school crews commenced in 1960/61 under Mr A. Bentley continued more enthusiastically last season. Rongotai College again coached by Mr A. Bentley and also by Mr N. Lynch, who transferred to Rongotai from New Plymouth Boys' High School where he had successfully coached rowing, produced a number of crews and were successful in winning, for the first time, the Archbishop Owen Cup for local secondary school eights race. As mentioned earlier, Wellington College, coached by Mr D. Miller, provided the Club with a first-class Novice Four and also boated an improving eight which only lost by two feet to Rongotai in the Owen Cup race.

The standard of rowing among these College boys is improving each year as the sport becomes more established in the Schools. Both Colleges use Star plant and facilities and already some ex-college oarsmen have joined the Club's membership.

SOCIALS:

Again the Club is indebted to a smaller ladies' committee who have accomplished sterling work at Club socials. Particular appreciation is due to Mesdames N. Schwass and L. McFarlane who freely gave time and energy in the preparation for many socials.

Opening Day.—The town Club's opening day was held on October 7, 1961, when the President of the W.A.R.A, Mr. J. Luke, officially opened the season. Water conditions were favourable for holding the Redding Shield whilst the Ladies' Committee arranged an excellent afternoon tea which was followed by the usual social function.

Opening Of Season Dance.—This dance, the first for many years, at the beginning of the season, was held in August, 1961, which was well attended and most successful

Old Members' Day.—Old Members' Day was held on March 17, 1962, when relay tubs races were held plus the annual swimming race. Afternoon tea was again arranged by the Ladies' Committee and the usual social function was enjoyed after the racing.

End-of-Season Dance.—This dance was held in lieu of the normal earlier Xmas Dance and although proved to be very successful was disappointing regarding the number attending. This dance was held on March 24, 1962.

Prize-Giving Dance.—This function was held on June 9, 1962, when again the attendance was disappointing. Those attending, however, obviously enjoyed themselves. The prizes won during the season were presented by a Life Active member, Mr W. Hillock.

Film Evening.—A film evening was also held on August 4, 1962, which, however, is beyond the scope of this report.
